Comments should remain relevant to the topic, and whilst we understand that users may have differing views and opinions, negative or offensive remarks will not be tolerated.

We will not allow:

- Language that is abusive, threatening or obscene
- Language that incites hatred or violence or targets individuals on the basis of HIV status, race/ethnicity, religion, gender, sexuality, nationality or political beliefs
- Comments that are deceptive, misleading or unlawful
- Comments that are inflammatory or off topic
- Commercial solicitation
- Comments about unrelated goods/services
- Violation of intellectual property rights
- Unrelated URLs

Moderation

Comments that criticise ASHHNA, ASHHNA members or associated organisations will be considered on a case by case basis. ASHHNA retains the right to respond to criticism or enable those criticised to respond. In this instance, users will be redirected to an appropriate ASHHNA delegate.
